3. Have you been in a compromising situation with a member of the opposite sex anywhere this past week or exposed yourself to sexually explicit material?
4. Have you lacked any integrity in your financial dealings? Have you spent money recklessly?
5. Have you given priority time to your family?
6. Have you damaged another person by your words, either behind their back or face to face?
7. Have you succumbed to a personal addiction?

8. Have you continued to remain angry toward another? Have you tried to forgive & reconcile?
9. Craft your own question. Do you have a goal for which you would like others to hold you accountable?
